## JOB DESCRIPTION: NURSE

Responsible to Program Coordinator and Camp Manager

## Qualifications:

- 1. Active membership in the Christian church.
- 2. Desire and commitment to serve God through a program of outdoor ministry.
- 3. Current Ontario Registration with the College of Nurses as a registered nurse (RN), or a registered practical nurse (RPN), or equivalent.
- 4. Current certificate of St. John's Ambulance first aid program or Red Cross first aid program.
- 5. Open, mature person.
- 6. Experience in first aid treatment and camp nursing.

## Responsibilities:

- 1. Attend full training program or day session during training week, if possible to:
  - a. Become acquainted with the staff.
  - b. Be provided with additional information about camp life.
  - c. Discuss health and safety procedures, precautions and routine with the staff.
  - d. Guide Counsellors in regards to their responsibilities in noting and reporting illness, injury or unsafe practices and conditions that might contribute to campers or staff accidents.
  - e. Guide Counsellors in identifying and reporting campers' dietary habits, failure to eat a variety of foods, rapid gain in weight or loss of sleep, nail biting, thumb sucking, bed wetting, and withdrawal of homesickness.
  - f. Instruct Counsellors in current first aid methods. All such treatments by Counsellors must be reported back to the Nurse.
- **2.** Make physical check of campers on their arrival and review all health records, discussing particular items with the parent/guardian concerned.
- **3.** Be responsible for any medication and first aid supplies brought by campers. Use as directed by camper's physician.
- **4.** Report all admissions to the infirmary and all major illnesses to the Program Coordinator.
- **5.** Check the living quarters and camp health and safety conditions daily.
- **6.** Observe and correct the dishwashing procedures after each mealtime.
- 7. Prepare and maintain first aid kits for kitchen, waterfront areas, and out trips.
- **8.** Administer all medications and treatments according to physicians' order and keep records of all such treatment. (This should be in a daily medical log and report.)
- **9.** Know how to reach the hospital used for emergencies, ambulance, route to the hospital, and emergency procedures on site.
- **10.** In addition to the close of camp evaluation, make a written report to include:
  - first aid equipment inventory,
  - requisitions for next summer,

- treatment records of campers and staff,
- infirmary and hospital admissions,
- recommendations for routine and general health procedures for the entire camp.
- **11.** Participate in staff meetings.
- 12. Attend final evaluation meeting and follow up and conclude business as necessary at the end of each session and the summer program.
